A Day in the Desert


Or, Doing It Our Way

Storming the Mojave desert with Dave Bickers, Joel Robert, and Roger deCoster were CW publisher Joe Parkhurst on his Matchless Metisse, Editor Ivan Wagar on one of the latest twin-port Suzuki motocross bikes, Managing Editor Dave Epperson on Mike Burke's 650-cc Triumph desert sled, Lesco's Jerry Platt on a GYT kitted Yamaha 250-cc single-cylinder, fresh from Japan, and longtime desert fox Bud Ekins on his Triumph Metisse.
