The 1986 IT200 can take it. For speed and stamina the IT200 borrows much of the technology developed for our championship-winning YZ motocrossers. The engine is a rugged 195cc reed-valve two-stroke single. An engine incorporating a Capacitor Discharge Ignition for tremendous dependability, as well as the Yamaha Energy Induction System (YEIS) for exceptional power, response and efficiency.

To endure the worst, the leading-axle front forks are a full 43mm in diameter, with both the air pressure and damping rate being adjustable.


In the rear, an aluminum box-section swing arm is part of a YZ-type Monocross with a rising rate linkage and remote reservoir. And it includes infinite spring preload adjustability and adjustable damping that alters compression and rebound in proportion.

New this year on the IT200 is an innovative disc brake with a two-piston, floating caliper and cross-drilled rotor for maximum stopping power in even the wettest, muddiest going.


Riders who want to stay on the move will appreciate quickrelease wheels, an elbow throttle mechanism, snail-type chain tensioner, and rugged Z-type spokes.

All of it built, of course, for the most important detail of all: Winning. Because all across the country, all around the world, the Yamaha IT200 has earned a reputation as a bike that goes for the gold.



The exclusive Yamaha Energy Induction System (YEIS) consists of a small chamber connected to the intake manifold. This chamber acts to dampen and otherwise absorb fluctuations in intake tract pressure and mixture velocity. In so doing, it evens out the air flow, resulting in better combustion, and superior power, torque and response in the low- and mid-range bands—with less fuel consumption and no additional moving parts.



Yamaha's Monocross single shock suspension has been developed and proven on race winning YZ motocross bikes. It gives a true rising rate by virtue of a sophisticated linkage, allowing free movement over small bumps with more control when the terrain gets tougher. On the IT200, it features a remote reservoir, infinitely adjustable preload, and rebound and compression damping adjustments.
